

## **Recap of Meetings in May 2012 – Items Relevant to Bicycle/Pedestrian Subcommittee**

### ***City Council***

*May 10:*

Four of five Councilmembers took part in a Council Ride at 8am on Bike to Work Day, riding from City Hall to the 46<sup>th</sup> and Adeline energizer station and back.

*May 15:*

The City Council approved the Pedestrian Bicycle Plan and related General Plan amendments, and approved BPAC's recommendation to write a letter to Assembly Member Nancy Skinner and Senate Member Loni Hancock urging and supporting a change to the Vehicle Code that would allow for bicyclists to treat stop signs as yields and not require a complete stop.

### ***Current Planning Projects***

*May 24:*

The Planning Commission held a Study Session on the proposed path on the east side of the Escuela Bilingue property. The Commission liked the design in general, but recommended the installation of gates at either end, which would require Council approval.

### ***Transportation Committee***

At its May 22, 2012 meeting the Committee recommended approval of two recommendations from the BPAC: 1) adopting an Anti-Harassment of Bicyclists Law, with amended text, and 2) installing three Fix It stations on Frontage Road, Doyle Street, and Park Avenue in front of City Hall, and appropriating \$6,500 of Measure B funds to pay for the pilot project.
