

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee

Feb. 3, 2014

5:30 – 7:32 p.m.

I. Introductions/Roll Call: Present: Chair, Tom Modic; Betsy Cooley, Scott Donahue, Laura McCamy, Ken Bukowski; Staff Marcy Greenhut, Mike Roberts, and Maurice Kaufman, Public Works; Sara Billing, Planning

Noted: Quorum not reached for this meeting. (Quorum=6 out of 10 members) No action taken on any items. Minutes are not organized into Information and Action items for this reason.

II. Public Comment about items not on the Agenda: None

III. Minutes from Jan. 6th were not approved due to lack of quorum.

IV. A. Oaklavia:

Staff Greenhut relayed message from Sal Bednarz, of Actual Café, that there still has not been responses to his doodle-calendar link, which was sent to BPAC members shortly after the Jan. 6th BPAC mtg., from anyone, so Staff will resend Sal’s message with doodle-link again.

B. Capital Improvements Program (CIP):

Staff Kaufman presented the CIP, pointing out that 23% of the budgeted items are bicycle and pedestrian projects. Discussion followed. No action taken. CIP will be presented again, for BPAC feedback, at the March 3rd BPAC meeting.

C. Bike To Work Day (BTWD):

Staff Kaufman announced that the City’s contribution to BTWD will increase by \$200 this year, from \$2800 for EBBC, to \$3000. City staff have been budgeted \$1000 to purchase materials for Energizer Stations. Staff Greenhut announced that she will attend the kick-off meeting Feb. 6th. Committee member McCamy suggested BTWD be on the March BPAC agenda to begin organizing Energizer Stations. Cynthia Armour, with EBBC, provided some background about BTWD.

VI. Staff Comments:

A Planning Department report:

Staff Billing announced several Bike-Ped related activities, including EBOT, the County-wide Pedestrian-Bicycle Working Group, the City Parks & Rec Committee discussion of Temescal Creek Park and Planning Commission review of Hyatt Place Hotel.

Jess from WOBO also represented the project. Traffic management described, re-routing of buses discussed, and nearest transit access considered. Second Saturday will kick off soon, a road-closure similar event, Oaklavia would build on that. Route maps were shared. BPAC voted unanimously to support the event by forming a subcommittee (Laura, Svante, Betsy & Tom) to engage Council and liaison with the Oaklavia planning organization. Councilmember Davis, present, suggested bringing this item to the Public Safety Committee, Marcy, staff suggested bringing this to the City Events Coordinator.

CITY COUNCIL

Here's an EBOTS update for BPAC, focusing on comments about pedestrian and bicycle access:

In December MIG summarized comments from the community workshops and questionnaire, and the Planning Commission provided comments.

Workshop participants, questionnaire respondents and Planning Commissioners agreed on the need for better bus stop lighting, seating, maintenance, cleanliness and safety.

Workshop participants requested complete networks where bicycles and buses are on different streets as much as possible.

Questionnaire respondents requested several types of bicycle improvements:

- Dedicated green bike lanes with rumble strips
- Bicycle awareness signs
- A BART car for bikes
- Bike lanes on 40th between San Pablo Ave and MacArthur BART
- Bike bridges over railroad tracks, for example at Powell St
- Bike lockers at BART stations.

(The Planning Commission didn't have any comments about bicycle access.)

The City Council will comment on trips, needs and desires on January 21.

The consultants will evaluate options in light of the comments we've received, and present an options evaluation at community meetings in May, committee meetings in June, and Council meetings in July.

IDAHO STOP LAW

Edits need to be made to the Idaho Stop Law letter. Staff will follow-up with the Idaho Stop Law in February.
