- I. Call to Order and Roll Call: 5:30 p.m.
- II. Public Comments: none.
- III. Approval of June 6, 2011 Minutes: approved by acclamation.
- IV. Action Items:
 - A. BPAC Letters of Support: Amber presented item. BPAC discussed and approved motion to allow Robert to sign letters of support. MSP Moss, Atkin (7-0-0)
 - B. Recommendation to ACTC BPAC: The BPAC requested more information for the next meeting and then interested individuals would contact staff.
 - C. Code Enforcement discussion: BPAC members decided to do their own research and discuss again next month. Davis and El Cerrito were mentioned as Cities to check with regarding PD training budgets and other ideas.
 - D. Idaho Yield Law: The history and provisions of the 1982 Idaho law were discussed. Stop signs were felt to be different from stop signals in relationship to any proposed law for California. Further research was needed.
 - E. 40th and Horton: Laura discussed her concerns about the intersection. If northbound traffic is not allowed in the future then the bike lane needs to be moved to the middle. Staff recommended that the issue be discussed in the ped-bike plan.
 - F. Bike Racks: The BPAC recommended \$1,500 in Measure B funds for more bike racks. MSP Ramsey, Laura (6-0-0)

 - B. Staff member Schultze-Allen informed the BPAC of upcoming meetings in Berkeley and Oakland on the draft countywide Bike-Ped plan and process.
