Emeryville is one of our most popular stations so we are excited by the wide range of projects Emeryville is proposing to include in the current call for the county and regional transportation plans, including:

- Amtrak Platform Extension to Bus Bays – to help passengers cross to/from the train boarding platform and the bus bays
- I-80 Powell St. Bus Bays – for AC Transit Transbay bus stops

The funding we seek is for trips which originate and end outside of Emeryville. These trips connect passengers to BART, AC Transit, Amtrak and the West Berkeley Shuttle.
