
Policy on Non-Discrimination on the Basis of Disability

AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

[GRADES: K-6]

The City of Emeryville after school program is a subsidized program offered in conjunction with the Emery Unified School district through ASES Grant. This full day extended after school program provides a warm, nurturing, and fun environment for students in grades K-6. Our staff maintains a maximum supervision and program creatively throughout the year, providing structured activities and supervision including: homework, assistance, science exploration, gardening, cooperative games, dance, drama, sports, nutritional snacks and more. In this program, emphasis is placed on offering the participants more critical thinking exercises and security in their independence to promote social, emotional, and cognitive development. Children must register with the Emeryville Community Services Department to participate. Children are escorted by staff to and from Anna Yates Elementary School to ensure a safe passage between sites. In the Adventure Works Program, every day is truly a great adventure.

TEEN CENTER AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM

[GRADES: 7-8]

Sign your teen up for our awesome after school program specifically designed for the tweens/teens. There will be gaming, dancing, sports, arts & crafts, a mandatory homework hour, tutoring and a host of other popular enrichment classes, activities, games, and snacks! Our teen lounge is equipped with Xbox 360 & Wii, with a few table top games for your teen's enjoyment. Come and meet your friends for these fun-filled days after a long day at school. Our seasoned Recreation Leader staff will provide the supervision.



Safe Routes to School Improvements Constructed in Time for Back to School at the New Emeryville Center of Community Life!

The City of Emeryville received Federal Highway Administration funding for Safe Routes to School improvements along San Pablo Avenue at 43rd, 45th and 47th Streets. The improvements, completed in July 2016, include pedestrian and cyclist triggered mast arm mounted warning beacons to facilitate the east-west crossing of San Pablo Avenue. Also included is an expanded median refuge, signal timing adjustments, curb extensions, speed feedback signs and bicycle sharrow markings to indicate cyclists have shared use for the right-most lane along San Pablo Avenue throughout Emeryville and to the south in Oakland. Be extra careful to watch your speed (the limit in a school zone is 25 miles per hour) this fall when the newly constructed ECCL receives an influx of students larger than ever before seen on this site.

These improvements are complemented by a school-based *Safe Routes to School* program, including incentives and safety trainings, and is coordinated with other such programs throughout Alameda County. Christie Avenue Grand Opening Celebrated in Emeryville on Bike to Work Day

The Christie Avenue Cycle Track Project includes separated lanes for cyclists and pedestrians traveling in both directions on the north side of Christie Avenue between Powell Street and Shellmound Street, a bicycle left-turn pocket, green thermoplastic markings and a dedicated bicycle signal. Cyclists stopping at the Bike to Work Day energizer station on their way north were thankful for the path's installation and most, when asked where they were headed, indicated either The Towers in Emeryville or Richmond employers such as Sunpower.

These improvements and accomplishments would not be possible without the City's partners:

- **Alameda County Transportation Commission (ACTC)** funded the project with Measure B and Vehicle Registration funds under the OBAG program
- **Association of Bay Area Governments (ABAG)** realigned the Bay Trail to incorporate the Christie Avenue Cycle Track

Bike East Bay polled members on which bike and pedestrian improvements they wanted ACTC to fund, and their members voted this project their top priority

The Christie Avenue Cycle Track is notable for representing several milestones:

- Emeryville joined Oakland and Berkeley in launching new bicycle infrastructure including protected bike lanes in celebration of the Annual Bike to Work Day in Alameda County. These types of improvements are regionally critical to cyclists' safety and access.
- On the day before Bike to Work Day and the project's opening, Emeryville was re-certified as a Bicycle Friendly Community and upgraded from Bronze to Silver, thanks in part to projects like this one that include protected lanes and bicycle signals.
- This project, and one at Golden Gate Fields in Albany, now allows cyclists to ride the Bay Trail uninterrupted from Richmond to San Leandro.
- Emeryville was the first city in Alameda County to complete a bicycle and pedestrian project under the One Bay Area Grant (OBAG) program, with funding from the County's Measure B transportation sales tax and Vehicle Registration Fees.


As part of a regional expansion through the Metropolitan Transportation Commission, bike share is being expanded in San Francisco, San Jose, Oakland, Berkeley, and Emeryville.

Beginning in 2016, Emeryville, Oakland and Berkeley will get over 100 bike share stations from Motivate (www.motivateco.com), the largest bike share operator in America. There will be high-capacity stations at commuter hubs like MacArthur and Ashby BART, and stations at high-density

areas serving residences, workplaces, and commercial areas. Ten stations will be located in Emeryville as a part of the first phase of the system's roll-out. Each of Emeryville's stations will have approximately ten bikes and twenty docks to start, and we hope to expand the system in the following years, adding bikes and stations throughout the city.

To use bike share, you purchase a daily, monthly, or annual membership (\$149 proposed), which covers the cost of unlimited trips under 30 minutes each. Discounts (of 40%) to the membership price will be available for low-income users enrolled in PGE's CARE program (see www.pge.com/en/myhome/saveenergymoney/financialassistance/care/index.page). Keep an eye out for information about bike share planning and siting as the system is designed.

EAST BAY SUNSHARES

East Bay SunShares is a regional solar electric bulk-purchasing and installation program managed by the Business Council on Climate Change (B3C) in San Francisco that assists property owners with obtaining solar electric systems to offset grid energy use. The program also includes an electric vehicle (EV) financing component with significant discounts for participating residents. Participating cities would partner with B3C and work with multiple East Bay entities, including Alameda and Contra Costa Counties, the city of Fremont, and others to market the program to their constituents and employees. A joint Request for Proposals will be issued, and a contractor will be selected from the bids which meet the requirements of the RFP. The goal is to spur lower pricing through bulk purchasing. The more property owners who sign up, the lower the pricing will be.

Update on Development Proposals



3900 ADELINE MIXED-USE PROJECT COMPLETED

The development project at 3900 Adeline Street is now complete, and folks are moving in to some of these units. The project consists of four three-story buildings over an underground parking garage and a landscaped courtyard at the podium level. Located right next to Oakland, this in-fill project is a mix of 91 residential units, 10 live/work units and about 1,000 square feet of retail space for people to explore.



BUILDING INSPECTIONS BREAK RECORD

With the increase in construction activity in the City of Emeryville, the Building Division set a new record for the most Inspections in the month of April 2016. Of the 3,422 Inspections 25% were on Major Development Projects and the remaining 75% of Inspections (over 2,500) were for other commercial and residential remodels. Even with the increased inspection activity, our hard-working Inspectors are able to respond to Inspection Requests with only 24 hour notice.

COUNCIL MAY REGULATE SHORT-TERM RENTALS



Radio Shack has left the East Bay Bridge Shopping Center and will be replaced by Sally Beauty Supply. And at the Bay Street Shopping Center the Levi Store will be replacing the Coach Store.

Development Regulations Change

RESIDENTIAL REGULATIONS AND BONUSES

The City has new rules for multi-unit residential development projects. Projects must include at least 50% two-or-more bedroom units, including at least 15% three-or-more bedroom units. All projects with 10 or more units must meet the Family-Friendly site and building design guidelines, and all required two-or-more bedroom units must meet Family-Friendly unit design guidelines. To get development bonuses, residential projects must provide affordable units in the project.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING IMPACT FEE

The developer impact fee for affordable housing has increased. Now a developer of a rental residential project must pay \$28,000 per unit into the City's affordable housing fund, or build affordable units in the project instead of paying the fee.

SIGNIFICANT STRUCTURES

AC ALERT

Sign up today
for AC Alert

The City uses two emergency notification systems to notify residents and businesses of emergency alerts. The Emeryville Police Department and the Alameda County Fire Department (ACFD provides fire services to Emeryville) use NIXLE, a nation-wide public safety alert system. **Simply text any zip code to 888777 and receive real-time alerts and advisories from the local police department and other public agencies.** This is a great way of keeping up with public safety alerts throughout the Bay Area and even travelling nation-wide just by entering the local zip code. There is no charge for registering but standard text messaging rates associated with your mobile phone service will apply. You can opt out anytime by texting "STOP" to 888777.

If you're texting a zip code to 888777 and using NIXLE for the first time, you can retrieve a temporary password to complete the registration process by going to the NIXLE website. Completing the registration process will allow you to fully customize how messages reach you - whether by mobile phone, email, or over the web - you decide!

The other system used for emergency notifications is the "AC Alert" System powered by Everbridge. AC Alert is a web-automated notification service that sends accurate and timely notifications of the information you want and need to know-straight from the City. With AC Alert, you control how you are contacted, whether it's on your cell, work and/or home phone, via text, email or voice message.

AC Alert will be used for emergencies, such as evacuation notices and post-earthquake or other disaster instructions; but, you can also sign up to receive automatic notices for public meetings, community events, and other non-emergency community outreach initiatives. There is no cost to sign up and your contact information will only be used to send out city notices.

AC ALERT works primarily through subscriptions so please sign-up today. You can determine the delivery modes (landline, cell phone, voice, text, email) for emergency notices as well as whether you wish to receive non-emergency notices, such as Earth Day, public hearings, and advisory committee meetings. If you have previously provided your information to another service such as CodeRED or Nixle, you will still need to register in AC Alert to ensure you receive emergency notifications and to control your locations and notification delivery methods.

Helpful Crime Preventive Tips from the Emeryville Police Department

- Enjoying the beautiful Bay Trail bicycle path that runs through Emeryville? **Please remember to jot down your bicycle's make/ model/ speed and serial number.** If we find a stolen bicycle it is easier to return to their owners if serial numbers are provided.
- **Never leave your bicycle outside unsecured.** Invest in a good bicycle lock but remember where there's a will there's a way, most locks can be defeated.
- **Take a picture of your bicycle and all of your prized possessions** for that matter. For quick documentation take an overall photo and a pic of any identifying marks including serial numbers and proof of sale.
- **Witnessed a crime? Be careful, get to a safe location and call 911 or The Emeryville Police non-emergency number (510) 596-3700.** Sometimes witnesses will follow a suspect and although officers understand you want to help, it can put you in a very dangerous situation. Witnesses should try to stay in one location in case officers need to speak to you.
- **If you witness a crime and see the suspect- try to remember what the suspect looked like, direction of flight and where the crime happened.** Dispatchers may ask you a lot of questions, and this information will be relayed to the patrol officers immediately.
- Don't want to get involved? It's understandable. **You can always report a crime and request to be anonymous.**
- **Remember if you see something, say something.** A strong community makes for a safe place for all of us.

Looking for Down Payment Assistance to Purchase a Home in Emeryville?

The City of Emeryville has a down payment assistance program to assist income-eligible, first-time homebuyers to purchase residential units in Emeryville through "silent" second mortgages. These low-interest, deferred-payment second mortgages can be used to reduce the amount needed to borrow from a primary mortgage lender, reducing monthly mortgage costs.

The First Time Homebuyer Loan (FTHB) program, is available to households earning at or below moderate income. The FTHB program may only be used for the purchase of market rate units.

The table below summarizes the program:

Interest Rate	75% of first mortgage interest rate
Loan Amount	Average \$50,000

The borrower must make at least a 3 percent down payment and occupy the unit as a primary residence during the duration of the loan term. The loan is due upon sale, transfer, when the unit ceases to be owner-occupied, or in 30 years, whichever comes first.

City of Emeryville Minimum Wage Annual Increase Effective July 1, 2016

The Emeryville City Council adopted the Emeryville Minimum Wage and Paid Sick Leave Ordinance (EMC 5-37) on July 2, 2015.

The Ordinance requires higher rates for minimum wage and paid sick leave for eligible employees than the State of California. It also requires that all Hospitality Service Charges are paid to the Hospitality Workers who work the events for which a service charge is collected. Each year the minimum wage rates will increase on July 1st.

New Minimum Wage Rates Effective JULY 1, 2016	
Small Businesses (55 or fewer Employees)	\$13.00/Hr
Large Businesses (56 or more Employees)	\$14.82/Hr*

Paid Sick Leave Requirements Remain the Same:	
Small Businesses (55 or fewer Employees)	48 Hours per year
Large Businesses (56 or more Employees)	72 Hours per year

BUSINESS LICENSE CERTIFICATES AND FEES

- Are you Self-Employed?
- Renting out Property in Emeryville?
- Running a Daycare?

Any individual, partnership, corporation or sole proprietor who wishes to conduct, either directly or indirectly, any business within the City of Emeryville must secure a business license certificate.

The City of Emeryville ordinance states that it is unlawful for any person to commence, transact, engage in or carry on business in the City without first having obtained a valid license and paid the license fee. Organizations operating entirely for the benefit of charitable purposes and those exempt from filing information returns under 26 U.S.C. §6033 (a)(2) are exempt from the payment of business license taxes. However, such organizations must still receive and maintain a current business license and are subject to an annual renewal and statement affirming its status as a charitable organization by March 1 of each year. Families, teachers and students, co-workers, come have some fun for a good cause. See for yourself what debris from inland ends up on our beaches and in our Bay (you may be surprised!).



Sign of the Times by Artist Seyed Alavi to be Refreshed and Restored

Seyed Alavi was originally commissioned by the City of Emeryville Art in Public Places Program to work with Emery High School students to design unified images for 17 utility boxes in Emeryville. The design played off the ubiquitous pedestrian image in traffic signs and signals and created an award-winning installation. The original locations were augmented with additional commissions and now 25 locations are adorned by Mr. Alavi's creations. This Fall, Mr. Alavi will refresh the images on each box and created 20 new images for installation on existing boxes, replacing older images. The new works will be done in the same style, with black vinyl on bright yellow paint and are reflective of current events. The boxes are being restored in part due to reoccurring graffiti. To address this, a new, high-tech nanotechnology anti-graffiti coating is being applied. Look for the new images in your neighborhood this fall while walking the dog, or take a ride down Shellmound or up Hollis for a peek at multiple new pieces. 


