  - 5.3 Pedestrian & Bicycle Collision History Data from the Transportation Injury Mapping System and Statewide Integrated Records Systems

Staff O'Connell gave a presentation on the use of the Statewide Integrated Records System (SWITRS) and Transportation Injury Mapping System (TIMS) as tools for mapping collision and incident data that include bicycles and pedestrians.
